Overview

The Western Region Billy Kart Derby is an annual Juniors event where juniors come together from across the region to compete together.

This event takes place across half a Saturday, usually an afternoon.

Boys compete together in teams of two (ideally from the same company). These teams are then sorted into groups of 2-3 pairs (ideally with a mix of companies). It is in these groups that the Boys rotate round the four competitions that make up the derby.

- Drag Race: racing in a straight line, approx 80m
- Pincer: racing around a rectangle, catching another team
- Circuit: racing around a longer circuit
- Obstacle: completing an obstacle course in the fastest time

This event aims to achieve the following purposes:

- 1. Provide Boys with a chance to compete
- 2. Provide Boys with an opportunity to connect with Boys from other companies
- 3. Encourage the teaching of woodwork and DIY skills in companies
- 4. Strengthen team work skills within a company

This event could also be adapted to include seniors.

Team

This event requires quite a large number of officers to run, however, some of the following roles may be done by the same person.

WR Billy Kart Derby Convenor

- Oversees whole event
- Coordinates promotion / registrations
- Coordinates Set Up / Pack Up

Admin Assistant

- Collects results
- Makes certificates
- Assists with overall functioning of the event

Safety Officer

- Oversees the whole event from a safety perspective
- Designated First Aider
- Should hold up to date first aid qualifications

Competition Facilitators (2 per competition)

- Run their designated competition
- Record Results
- Supervise Boys
- Follow safety arrangements

Afternoon Tea

• Coordinate afternoon tea for all Boys, families and leaders.

Each competition round includes 20 minutes of competition and 5 minutes of switching.

Calendar

Here is a rough calendar for this event.

Beginning of Year - Date released on annual calendar / venue booked

6 weeks before event - Promo starts / Regos open

3 Weeks before - reminder email to parents

1 week before event - close regos so proper planning can take place (send final email before regos close)

The event!

Equipment Needed

Billy Karts (soap box style, see appendices)

Cones (as many as possible)

Certificates

Food and Drink for Afternoon Tea

Make sure water is available

Sunscreen may be required (depending on UV level)

PA system may be needed if venue is large enough



Drag

The course is to be a straight line, of approximately 80 metres.

Teams are to take turns within their group at attempted to travel down the course as quickly as possible.

Each pair will get four attempts at this. (swap driver/pusher after the first two). The best of their four attempts will be counted.

One leader will need to be at the start of the course, and one at the end.

Safety Points

Ensure the Boy pushing gently brakes the kart at the end of the course.

Ensure only one team is participating at a time.

Ensure helmets, knee pads, elbow pads and wrist guards are being worn by Boys who are steering.

Pursuit

The pursuit race is based on a cycling pursuit race. The course shape is a rectangle as pictured below. Teams start at the two opposite corners and try to catch each other.

For one team to catch another, they are required to get their front wheel in line with the feet of the pusher of the kart in front. They are attempting to pull up beside them, **not** run into the back of them.

If a team hits the ankles of a Boy pushing a kart, the round ends and they are instantly given the maximum time of 3 minutes.

The time it takes a team to catch up is then recorded (max 3 minutes).

Each team should have 2 attempts at this (swapping driver and pusher).

If any team hits the markers at the corners of the rectangle, they must come to a complete stop before starting to move again.

Safety Points

Ensure Boys pushing gently brakes the kart at the end of the course. Ensure corners are not being taken too sharply.

Ensure helmets, knee pads, elbow pads and wrist guards are being worn by Boys who are steering.



Circuit

The circuit is the longest competition, approx 200m.

Boys must go all the way around the course in the quickest time possible.

Teams should get 2 attempts at this course (switching driver and pusher). Their lowest time will be counted.

It is recommended to have a leader out on the course to help direct and supervise the Boys.

Safety Points

Ensure the Boy pushing gently brakes the kart at the end of the course.

Ensure corners are not being taken too sharply.

Ensure helmets, knee pads, elbow pads and wrist guards are being worn by Boys who are steering.

Obstacle

The obstacle course is perhaps the most challenging of the competitions as it requires more steering skill rather than pushing speed.

Every time an item in the course is touched by any part of the kart, the Boys driving **or the pusher** a 3 second penalty should be added on.

No part of the course is allowed to be moved.

The maximum time allowed for this attempt is 3 minutes.

Each team should have 2 attempts (switching drivers and pushers). Their best time will be recorded.

Safety Points

Ensure the Boy pushing gently brakes the kart at the end of the course.

Ensure corners are being taken in a safe manner.

Ensure helmets, knee pads, elbow pads and wrist guards are being worn by Boys who are steering.

This may be the most frustrating competition for the Boys to compete in. It is important to maintain a zero tolerance policy for bullying of any kind and to continually encourage them to work as a team.

Results Calculation

The Billy Kart Derby is made up of 2 separate categories of awards.

Type One: Teams for each Competition

For each competition, 1st, 2nd and 3rd place certificates are awarded to the respective teams. These are simply based on times.

- Drag Race: shortest time to complete
- Pincer: Shortest time to catch the other team
- Circuit: shortest time to complete the track
- Obstacle: shortest time to complete the circuit

Type Two: Overall Company

The companies are also ranked based on how they have performed. This is calculated with the average of how each company has performed across all their teams.

Thus a company with 2 teams with scores of 2mins and 3mins would have a score of 2.5mins for the respective activity.

The companies are then ranked in order of average speed in each competition. For first place, 3 points are received, for second place, 2 points, for third place, one point.

The company with the most points is then declared the overall winner.

The results are calculated in this way to try and ensure that larger companies don't dominate the competition.



Safety Briefing Notes

Here are some notes on safety, it is important that leaders and Boys are aware of these and follow them at all times.

1. Personal Safety Equipment

- a. All persons driving karts must be wearing the following
 - i. Helmet
 - ii. Knee pads
 - iii. Elbow pads
 - iv. Wrist guards

2. Steering

- a. While steering it is important not to turn sharply, this can cause the kart to tip. (this should be practiced during the team practice time)
- b. It is important to communicate to the person pushing when you are turning
- c. Only one Boy is permitted to be sat on the kart at a time

3. Pushing

a. Whenever the kart is moving, a hold of the steering Boys' shoulders must be maintained. This is because the Boy who is pushing also acts as the breaks.

4. Preventing Collisions

- a. There are no air bags or seat belts on billy karts
- b. To prevent collision, only ride the karts when instructed to and only in the direction / location you have been instructed to.

5. Teamwork

a. To mitigate against negative emotional impacts of dysfunctional team work, ensure Boys are reminded that they are a team and they are not to blame one another if things go wrong. They should instead work as a team to improve together.



- Any medical information pertaining to their participation


Kart Specifications

1. General Kart Specifications

- a. There are to be no portions protruding from the cart which, in the opinion of the scrutineer, are likely to cause bodily harm or considered otherwise dangerous.
- b. Carts must not be power driven or mechanically assisted.
- c. Steering mechanism must be sound.
- d. Brakes are optional.


2. Kart Specifications (Soap Box)

- a. Dimensions of the cart must be as per the below diagrams.
- b. Chassis to be made from timber members
- c. All four wheels are to be made of sold rubber
- d. The cart must be able to be carried by the participating team (2 Boys) for 5m.
