Boys' Brigade Victoria Ping Pong-a-thon?

The Ping Pong-a-thon is a fundraising charity that supports the work of 8 partner organisations in South East Asia all work to end slavery.

Currently there are over 40 million people trapped in slavery around our world.

Here are some descriptions of where the money we raise will be going.





Hard Places work with hundreds of street-living and street-working boys and girls who are at high risk of being sold for sex in Cambodia's capital city. Through daily kids club programs in city parks and English and computer classes and art/play therapy at the Hard Places day centres, young people learn about decision-making, choices, hope, love, and relationship.

International Justice Mission adopts a holistic response to the issue of sextrafficking, partnering with local authorities to provide rescue and restoration for victims, bring criminals to justice and strengthen criminal justice systems as an ongoing preventative measure.



Boys' Brigade Victoria Premise

This year BBV is holding a state-wide, seniors table tennis marathon and aims to raise \$10,000. This is enough money to rescue, rehabilitate and retrain 6 people from slavery.

On the 27th of October BBV seniors will gather at Knox Community Baptist Church and play table tennis.

This event will help the fight against slavery as well as being a good opportunity to establish stronger intercompany relationships as we band together to fight for the freedom of millions of slaves.





Boys' Brigade Victoria Online Fundraising


The main fundraising for the Ping Pong-a-thon is generated using their online fundraising platform.

Through this site BBV will be able to have its own team registered, and boys will be able to sign up under the BBV team.

Once each boy or officer has signed up he will have his own individual fundraising page that he will be able to share with his friends and family.



Fundraising

All fundraising will come from Boys and officers creating their own fundraising page and asking their friends and family to sponsor them. More information on how funds are raised can be found later in this document.

According to data from 2020 the average amount raised per person was \$271.20. If we assume that 40 boys will attend the event then we can anticipate to raise approx. \$10.2K.

Packing up table tennis tables, media station, sleeping arrangements, ect.




Boys' Brigade Victoria Venue






Boys' Brigade Victoria Food



Boys' Brigade Victoria Company Fundraising Pyramid

This is ideally what each company's fundraising would resemble.



This diagram is not mandatory in any way, but gives an idea of what an expected response to should look like.

From this we can make a number of conclusions:

- Not to be disheartened if every boy doesn't raise tones of money
- To put more effort into helping the boys who want to put more effort in to succeed, rather than chasing people who aren't really interested
- And that selling the issue of slavery is super important as this inspires boys to go all out in their fundraising.
