The main purpose of The Boys' Brigade is to spread the Gospel to young people all around the world, giving them the opportunity to come and know Jesus as their personal saviour. And then to promote, guide and help their journey all to become like Christ, the truest example of Christian manliness.

We achieve this by promoting obedience, reverence, discipline and self-respect in all we do. These attributes may be viewed as old fashioned or out of date or unnecessary for today. But if you were employing someone: Would you want them to never listen to anything you said? Or to have no respect for God in anything they did? or to have no discipline to get tasks done? Or to have no honour or dignity? The answer for most of us, would be no.

These characteristics are important for life and faith as a Christian and were all displayed by Jesus in His earthly ministry.

BB-CHURCH RELATIONSHIP



Boys' Brigade exists as a large international ministry with over 1,000,000 young persons involved. It has its own structures, programs, events and bodies as well as over 135 years of experience in running youth ministries.



But at its heart, BB is a local church ministry.

Each Boys' Brigade company operates through a local church to reach out into the community, spreading the good news of Jesus Christ through our programs.

The local church has complete control over:



The leaders who run the program, including who the captain, chaplain and OICs are.



The Spiritual teaching of a company



The weekly program that a company runs



The other activities that a company runs

And of course, BB at all levels exists to help local churches achieve these goals and advance Christ's Kingdom.

Opening Parade

A formal opening to the night, opening prayer, rolls marked and announcements.

Squad Time

Gives the seniors a chance to bond as a team

Drill

Marching is used to teach boys: obedience, discipline, self respect as well as team work

Achievements

Boys learn skills such as car maintenance, camp/hike skills or budgeting

Games

The physical component of the evening, a chance for fun and team/moral building

Devotions

Teaching about the Christian faith from Scripture

Closing Parade

A formal end to the evening





COMPANY LEADERSHIP

Each BB company is run by a team of trained officers with different ranks and roles.

Church Leadership

The company is a ministry of a local church and is ultimately run by the leadership of that church.



Captain

The Captain is in charge of all aspects of the company and is entrusted by church leadership successfully lead all other officers.



Chaplain

The Chaplain is of the same rank as the other officers and looks after the Spiritual welfare of the company, its boys and officers.



Officer In Charge (OIC)

Each section of a company (anchors, juniors, seniors) has an officer in charge of it.



Lieutenants & Warrant Officers

All other officers are either Lieutenants or Warrant Officers. These officers run the various sections of the company night. Lieutenants are a higher rank than Warrant Officers and are appointed based on experience and training.





COMPANY ACTIVITIES

These are events that we usually run every year for our boys and are included in the annual fees.



Company Camp

We have a weekend of fun activities at Camp McLaren (the BB Campsite) in Yarra Junction

ANZAC Sleep Over

We believe it is important to remember those who have given up their lives so that we can be free. Every year we have a sleepover on the 24th of April before going down early on ANZAC day morning to the cenotaph.





Church Parade

Many members of the church don't get to see what activities we are doing, so every year we have a church parade to help connect us to our church.

Junior's Big Day Out

Our Juniors have an exciting annual trip out for the day. In the past we have gone to places like Karyl Castle or Sovereign Hill.

Boys who have attended leadership courses have the opportunity to apply to be a Non-Commissioned Officer as either a Lance Corporal, Corporal or a Sergeant.

NCOs then serve on the company NCO Council which runs various aspects of 14th VIC Werribee. This gives them an opportunity to practice leadership skills and team work as well as be mentored by older officers in the company.

FEES

All the programs and activities that Boys' Brigade operates for boys can not happen without funds.

BB requires no funds from the local church through which it operates and is funded by charging an annual fee to parents whose boys are in the program.
